Mrs A. Corson, trainer of **REBEL WOMAN** running in the fifth, requested that her horse be allowed to go post early. Mr. K. Kukk, trainer of **STEELY**, running in the second and **HERBALIST** running in the fourth, requested permission to go to post early and mount in the chute if required to do so. The Stewards considered the requests and duly granted permission.

The Stewards Secretary reported that the routine test of **PAR THREE**, trained by Mr. A. Carroll, at the Bank Holiday 24th May 2015 meeting had proved negative for substances and no further action was needed.

**Race 1 – 6.30pm. THE MIDSUMMER HURDLE**

The Stewards interviewed the Medical Officer, Dr. G. Robertson as to whom had given permission for the ambulance to come on track, the Doctor confirmed it was on his instruction. The Stewards Secretary advised that this was in line with new protocols for response times to attend to jockeys who had fallen. The Doctor confirmed that Mr. M. Batchelor had been passed fit to continue to ride but would be monitored for the rest of the meeting. The Veterinary Officer reported that **ROSSETTI** was unharmed.

**Race 2 – 7.05pm. THE GREEN VALLEY HANDICAP**

The Stewards interviewed Mr J. Moon, trainer of **HAWAIIAN FREEZE**, placed first, ridden by Mr R. Hodson as to the horse's previous poor performance. The trainer reported the horse was ridden well and the jockey had ridden to instruction, keeping the horse 'tucked up'. The trip and ground should have also suited the mare, the trainer will continue to work the horse at home and it should continue to improve. The Stewards noted his explanation and took no further action.

**Race 3 – 7.40pm. THE EPISODE FUND HANDICAP**

The Stewards interviewed Mrs. A. Corson, trainer of **RAINBOW CHARLIE**, ridden by Miss N. Looby as to the behaviour of the gelding in the Parade Ring and at the Start. The trainer reported that the horse was carrying a lot of weight and when the jockey mounted the horse the saddle slipped, thus unsettling him. The Stewards noted this explanation and took no further action.

**Race 4 – 8.15pm. THE PRAXISIFM HANDICAP MILE**

The Stewards called an enquiry in to the Start. Following a review of the tape and having interviewed the Starter, Mr. D. Germain the Stewards allowed the result to stand. They noted the winner **EIGHTFOLD**, trained by Mrs. A. Corson and ridden by Mr. M. Lawson had caught the others napping.

The Stewards interviewed Mr. K. Kukk as to the behaviour of **HERBALIST**, ridden by Mr. M. Quinlan. He reported this was the first time the horse had behaved this way. The Stewards noted his explanation and took no further action.

**Race 5 – 8.50pm. THE 'LET IT BE' HANDICAP**

The Stewards called an enquiry into possible interference inside the final furlong between **MRS BURBIDGE**, placed first, trained by Mr. N. Mullholland, ridden by Mr. M. Quinlan and **GREY PANEL**, placed third, trained by Mr. A. Le Brocq, ridden by Mr. R. Hodson, who in turn interfered with **CARRERA**, placed second, trained by Mrs. A. Malzard, ridden by Mr. M. Batchelor.

Having heard evidence and viewed a recording of the race they allowed the result to stand. The Stewards found Mr. M. Quinlan guilty of careless riding and duly fined him £50. The Stewards were unable to interview Mr. R. Hodson for a second time as he had left the course, despite being asked not to. Therefore the enquiry remains open.
